

Some universities require applicants to take an admissions test as part of their application. You need to ensure that you register your students for the test well before the given deadline. This flyer gives you an overview of admissions tests, all the important registration deadlines, and details about how to register your students.

Mathematics Admissions Test (MAT) for Imperial College London and the University of Warwick The MAT is also required for application to Imperial for all BSc and MSci Mathematics courses if applications are made before the MAT registration deadline and if applicants are taking A levels or IB. (For applications made after that, conditional offers for A level or IB candidates will involve STEP.) If applying to Warwick for the Mathematics BSc degree or Master of Mathematics degree, applicants are encouraged to take the MAT, STEP, or the Test of Mathematics for University Admission. Taking a test is not compulsory for Warwick, however, a good performance on the MAT or the Test of Mathematics for University Admission may result in a reduced offer.					

¹ Students must check directly with the university to confirm which admissions test(s) they are required to take, as admissions tests requirements are subject to change.

² Fees are also payable in Euros and US Dollars.

³ The Test of Mathematics for University Admission is not compulsory; however, a good performance on this test may result in a reduced offer from institutions that accept results.

⁴ These tests are developed by the University of Oxford and administered by Cambridge Assessment Admissions Testing, with the exception of ELAT and TSA, which are developed and administered by Cambridge Assessment Admissions Testing.

* International applicants (those who are not ordinarily resident in the UK or EU) to Brighton and Sussex Medical School are not required to sit BMAT.

† Applies to 'overseas for fees' applicants only.

Where do your students take their admissions test(s)?*

Your students can take an admissions test at your own school or college, if it's registered as an authorised test centre.

If your school/college is not already an authorised test centre, see 'Becoming a test centre' below.

Becoming a test centre

The final deadline to apply to become a test centre for November 2017 tests is 30 September 2017.

Step 1:

Provide us with information about your institution, using our online form:

Step 2:

We will contact you with information about your application. If successful, we will provide you with log-in details for the Entries Extranet and Results Online websites:

Once authorised, you can then register your students as test candidates.

Registering your students

Make sure you register your students well before the test registration deadline dates. In most cases, if your school/college misses the final deadline and your students can't take the test, the university will not consider their application.

Step 1:

Collect the student's details, using the relevant form provided on our website. General instructions can be found at: admissionstestingservice.org/how-to-register

Step 2:

Log in to the Entries Extranet and enter the student's details from the form. Once the student has been registered, make a note of their candidate number.

Step 3:

Give the student their candidate number, as confirmation they're registered.

Some students may need to take more than one admissions test. Your school/college will need to register the student separately for each admissions test.

Preparation

Our admissions tests do not require a lot of extra study – they test skills and knowledge that your students are expected to have already.

We provide a range of **free** preparation resources on our website, such as sample papers, past papers, test specifications and suggested further reading. It is not necessary to pay for an admissions test preparation course or additional material(s) to succeed in an admissions test.
